BA STUDIES – 3 YEARS

- Offer an intensive programme of courses in linguistics, literature and culture of a given language (2300-2500 contact hours in 3 years).
- Provide a solid grounding in the language of the field of study (C1 level) and at least one additional language (B2 level).
- Teach the students how to master knowledge, associate facts, analyse linguistic and cultural phenomena and make their syntheses.
- Teach them basic research skills – to complete their BA degree students write and defend a thesis of ca. 35 pages.
- Prepare students to continue their education at a Master's level.



MA STUDIES – 2 YEARS

- Combine content courses (900-1000 contact hours in 2 years) with individual research.
- Offer expert supervision of student research.
- Encourage students to develop their research skills in scholarly circles (student conferences, publications).
- To complete their MA degree students write a dissertation of ca 90 pages.
